Resolve, to Establish a Task Force to Study the Feasibility of a Single Claims Processing System for 3rd-party Payors of Health Care Benefits.

Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved: That the Task Force on Single Claims Processing, referred to in this resolve as the "task force," is established to study the feasibility of a single claims processing system for 3rd-party payors of health care benefits; and be it further

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Sec. 2. Task force membership. Resolved: That the task force representatives of the following interests: hospitals, physicians, home health agencies, nursing facilities, independent nonphysician practitioners, health insurers, mental health agencies, pharmacists and consumers of health care. Governor and the Superintendent of Insurance shall each appoint 6 members to the task force and the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall each appoint 4 members to the task of The Superintendent Insurance shall coordinate appointments with other appointing authorities to ensure that all interests are represented; and be it further

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Appointments: meetings. Resolved: Sec. 3. That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. Within 15 days of appointment of all members, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the task The task force shall select a chair from among its members; and be it further

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#### Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall:

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- 1. Gather and examine information from other jurisdictions that have implemented a single claims processing system;
- 2. Identify barriers and problems that need to be addressed to implement a single claims processing system;

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- 3. Determine resources necessary to implement a single claims processing system; and
- 4. Determine impact on health care providers; and be it further

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Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Bureau of Insurance shall contract to provide the necessary support services; and be it further

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Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the task force serve without compensation or reimbursement of any type; and be it further

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Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the task force shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature no later than February 2, 1998. If the task force requires an extension, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.

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### **SUMMARY**

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This resolve establishes the Task Force on Single Claims Processing to study the feasibility of a single claims processing system for 3rd-party payors of health care benefits. The task force shall submit its report to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature.
