§4710. Peer mediation and conflict resolution

All public elementary and secondary schools shall develop and adopt, within 3 years of the effective date of this section, as part of the curriculum, a comprehensive peer mediation and conflict resolution program.

This bill requires public elementary and secondary schools to implement a comprehensive peer mediation and conflict resolution program addressing the students' social and academic behaviors.
