6	Whereas, diversion of revenues from utility overcharges poses an immediate threat to ratepayers; and
8	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
10	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and

14	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

20	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if the commission determines that the rates charged by a utility are, or
2 2	have been, in excess of what is just and reasonable, the
24	commission may not direct that the overcollection be set aside, expended or otherwise used for any purpose other than reduction
26	of rates charged to those customers who have been overcharged or direct rebates to those customers.
28	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
30	preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

34	This bill prohibits the Public Utilities Commission from
36	directing utility customer overcharges to be used in any manner other than reduction of the rates charged to those customers who have been overcharged or direct repates to those customers.
