An Act to Allow the Maine Forest Service to Retain Funds from the Sale of Real Estate.

Submitted by the Department of Conservation pursuant to Joint Rule 204. Reference to the Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry suggested and ordered printed.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §8003, sub-§3, ¶M, as amended by PL 1993, c. 335, §1, is further amended to read:

The Except for lands acquired under the authority of 6 Μ., paragraph N, the director is authorized, with the consent of 8 to sell, grant, transfer the commissioner, lease, or otherwise convey any real or personal property under the 10 jurisdiction of the bureau. The director shall deposit the proceeds from the sale or lease of property purchased-with Maine-Forestry-District-tax-funds in Forest Fire Control 12 This-authority-does-not-apply-to-lands-acquired Accounts. under-the-authority-of-paragraph-Nr--Property-at-the-state 14nursery-may-be-sold-for-agricultural-or-forestry-purposes-if 16 surplus-to-the-needs-eff-the-nursery-and-the-proceeds-are retained--by--the--Maine--Forest--Service---The--bureau--shall transfer-the-low-lovel-radioactive-waste-site-on-the-state 18 nursery-property,-along-with appropriate buffors and access, to-the-University-of-Maine- and the University of -Maine-shall 20 accept-the-transfer. At least 60 days prior to offering any 22 surplus property for sale under this paragraph, the director shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council and the joint standing committee of the Legislature 24 having jurisdiction over natural forest resources of the director's intent to sell the property. 26

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Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §8003, sub-§3, ¶M-1 is enacted to read:

30 M-1. The proceeds under paragraph M may be used only to upgrade existing structures owned by the Division of Forest 32 Fire Control, to consolidate operations of the division through the improvement, repair, replacement, purchase or construction of structures and to purchase land upon which 34 to build structures. Ownership of any land purchased under 36 this paragraph or structures purchased or constructed under this paragraph must be held in the name of the division. 38 Ownership of land or property purchased under this paragraph may also be held in the name of the Bureau of General Services when the division participates in the consolidation 40 of facilities with other state agencies. Any purchase of 42 land or a structure pursuant to this paragraph must be approved by the Director of the Bureau of General Services.

SUMMARY

This bill authorizes the Director of the Bureau of Forestry to use the proceeds from the sale or lease of any bureau property, except for state forests and natural areas, to upgrade

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existing structures owned by the Division of Forest Fire Control, 2 to consolidate operations of the division through the improvement, repair, replacement, purchase or construction of structures and to purchase land upon which to build structures. 4 It also requires that any land purchased and any structures б purchased or constructed be held in the division's name. The exception is that the bureau may participate in joint efforts to 8 consolidate a facility with other agencies provided that the Bureau of General Services has ownership of the property or structure. In addition, the bill places a requirement that all 10 purchases of land or structures be approved by the Bureau of which has statewide oversight 12 General Services, of state facilities.

This bill also changes a reference to the committee to which the Director of the Bureau of Forestry must report before offering surplus property for sale. The reference is changed from the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over forest resources.

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Finally, this bill eliminates obsolete references to the 24 sale of property at the state nursery and to the transfer of the low-level radioactive waste site on the state nursery property. 26 Both of these actions have already taken place.

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
