If approved by the voters, this resolution may have future cost implications during primary and general elections if a 2nd ballot is required to accommodate all of the elected officials due to the limited space on the ballots. The cost of adding a 2nd ballot is \$95,000.'

SUMMARY

This amendment adds a provision prohibiting the Secretary of State from serving more than 2 consecutive popularly elected terms. This amendment will allow 8 consecutive years of service, which keeps the limit on consecutive service the same as under the current statutory term limits law. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
