30	Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall coordinate with
	personal watercraft distributors, dealers, rental agents and

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The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall encourage personal watercraft distributors, dealers and rental agents to offer safety training programs and materials and shall undertake an evaluation of the current safety training and education programs offered by distributors, dealers and rental agents. That evaluation may include examples of the types of educational materials being distributed, descriptions of the training and education programs being offered, the number of distributors, dealers and rental agents offering those programs or materials and the number of people who participate in those programs or received those materials.

The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall 14 report to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife on these assessment efforts by February 1, 1998.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife will incur some minor additional costs to submit a required report to the Legislature. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.

28 This bill may increase the number of civil suits and civil violations filed in the court system. The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional filing fees and fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill and changes the title of the bill.

42 The amendment updates the definition of personal watercraft to include jet-propelled vessels 14 feet or less and creates a 44 civil violation for the imprudent operation of a watercraft on inland waters that is enforceable either by the Department of 46 Inland Fisheries and Wildlife or by private civil action.

48 The amendment also requires the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to work with personal watercraft

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distributors, dealers, rental agents and users to promote industry-sponsored safety and education programs and to assess the rate of participation and the effectiveness of industry-sponsored personal watercraft safety training programs and educational materials.

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
