An Act to Change the Weekly Employee Pay Requirement in State Law.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §621, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1995, c. 340, §1, is further amended to read: 4

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mechanical, mining, quarrying, mercantile, restaurant,

Certain employers; weekly payment required.

corporation, person or partnership engaged in a manufacturing,

summer camp, beauty parlor, amusement, commercial laundry or dry

Every

hotel,

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cleaning establishment, telegraph or telephone business; in any of the building trades; in logging or lumbering operation; upon public works or in the construction or repair of roads, bridges, sewers, gas, water or electric light works, pipes or lines; every incorporated express company or water company; and every steam railroad company or corporation shall pay weekly each employee

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engaged in its business the wages earned by the employee to 16 within 8 days of the date of that payment; every county shall so 18 pay every employee who is engaged in its business the wages or salary earned by that employee, unless the employee requests in writing to be paid in a different manner. Municipalities shall 20 pay their employees at least once every 2 weeks unless the employee agrees to be paid under a less frequent pay schedule. 22 An employee who is absent from that employee's regular place of employment at a time fixed for payment must be paid on demand. 24 The director may grant a waiver to an employer who wishes to pay 26 employees on a biweekly basis.

## SUMMARY

This bill will allow employers covered by this section to apply for a waiver from the weekly pay requirement. It also adds 32 commercial laundries and dry-cleaning establishments to the 34 industries covered by this section.
