An Act to Require That Headlights Be on during Inclement Weather.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2067, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:

1. Display of lights. A vehicle located on a way must be equipped with lights as described in section 1904. The lights must be illuminated during the period 1/2 hour after sunset to 1/2 hour before sunrise and at any time when, windshield wipers are used due to insufficient—light—or unfavorable atmospheric conditions, including, but not limited to, rain, freezing rain, fog or snow, persons—or vehicles—on—the—way—are—not—discernible fer—a—distance—of—1,000—feet—ahead. This section does not apply to a vehicle that is parked or standing off the main traveled portion of the way.

This bill requires that, whenever windshield wipers are used due to inclement weather conditions, headlights must also be used.
