An Act to Require a Person Applying for a Moose Permit to Possess a Hunting License.

2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7463-A, sub-§4, as amended by PL 1995, c.
4	443, $\S1$, is further amended to read:
б	4. Hunting permits. In accordance with the provisions of subsections 1-A and 2-A, the commissioner may issue moose hunting
8	permits and may establish the number of moose hunting permits to be issued for each moose hunting zone. No more than 10% of the
LO	moose hunting permits may be issued to nonresident and alien hunters. A person whese-application-is-selected may purchase
12	apply for a moose hunting permit upon presentation of proof that the person possesses:
L4	A. A valid Maine hunting license, if the person is a
Lб	resident of the State; or
18	B. A valid Maine big game hunting license, if the person is a nonresident or alien.
20	The fee for a moose hunting permit is \$25 for 1993, \$27 for 1994,
22	\$28 for 1995 and \$29 for 1996 and every year thereafter for residents and \$200 for 1993, $$202$ for 1994, and \$300 for 1995 and
24	every year thereafter for nonresidents and aliens. While hunting moose, each nonresident or alien hunter, both permittee and
26	subpermittee, must be in possession of a valid Maine nonresident or alien big game hunting license, whichever is applicable.
