

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §5805, sub-§2,** as enacted by PL 1981, c.
6 693, §§5 and 8, is repealed and the following enacted in its
8 place:

10 2. Maximum allowable tuition. School units may establish
12 tuition rates based on actual cost in accordance with subsection
14 1. The maximum allowable tuition charge may not exceed actual
16 cost.

14 SUMMARY

16 This bill allows school units to establish tuition rates for
18 nonresident students based on actual cost, but not exceeding that
cost. It eliminates the current maximum allowable tuition based
on the state average per public secondary school student.
