	fees. The fee for a resident license may not exceed \$200 and the fee for a nonresident license may be not more than
	twice the resident fee, except that the municipalities of
	St. George, Cushing, South Thomaston, Thomaston and Warren may fix license fees at any amount for the purpose of generating revenue to sustain their shellfish conservation
	programs.
