An Act to Require Responsibility of the Employers of Persons who Collect Signatures.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §904-A, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 599, §1, 4 is amended to read:

6 §904-A. Payment per signature; prohibition

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8 A person may not pay a circulator of an initiative or a referendum petition or a <u>another</u> person who causes the 10 circulation of an initiative or referendum petition may--net receive-payment for the collection of signatures if that payment 12 is based on the number of signatures collected. Nothing in this section prohibits a circulator of an initiative or a referendum petition or a person who causes the circulation of an initiative 14 or referendum petition from being paid a salary that is not based 16on the number of signatures collected.

SUMMARY

This bill prohibits a person from paying a circulator of 22 petitions based on the number of signatures collected. This bill shifts the responsibility from the collector of the signatures to 24 the person paying the collector.
