Sec. 1. Committee established. Resolved: That the Select Committee on Comprehensive Tax Reform, referred to in this resolve as the "committee," is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Committee membership. Resolved: That the committee consists of the following members: All 13 members of the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation; the State Tax Assessor; the Executive Director of the Maine Municipal Association or the director's designee; the Executive Director of the Maine Center for Economic Policy; and 3 members appointed by the Governor, at least 2 of whom must represent the general public. The cochairs of the committee are the cochairs of the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation; and be it further

- Sec. 3. Duties. Resolved: That the committee shall undertake a study of the current taxation system and tax policies in the State and strive to establish a comprehensive tax reform package. The committee shall review the following:
- 1. The current procedures for raising revenue through taxation in the State;

- 2. All exemptions established by law to the sales and use tax, the income tax and the property tax;
- 3. Any inconsistencies in current tax law:
- 4. Any anticipated restrictions on and demand for revenue that would have to be included in future budgets of the State, counties and municipalities; and
  - 5. Any other taxation issues determined relevant and necessary to review by the committee; and be it further

- Sec. 4. Report. Resolved: That the committee shall submit its report, including any implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature by January 30, 1998; and be it further
- Sec. 5. Staffing. Resolved: That the committee may request staff assistance from the Legislative Council. The Bureau of Taxation shall provide general staffing assistance to the committee.
