An Act to Create Industrial Enterprise Districts to Promote Economic Development and to Retain and Increase Good Quality Jobs by Providing More Competitive Electric Rates within the Districts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §3196 is enacted to read:

§3196. Industrial enterprise districts

The governing body of any municipality in this State may petition the commission to establish within the municipality an industrial enterprise district in which reduced electric rates are available to eligible businesses. The commission shall adopt rules governing the establishment of industrial enterprise districts, eligibility requirements for businesses, the setting of reduced rates and other terms and conditions associated with any reduced rate offering. The commission's rules must encourage the expansion of existing industrial plants and facilities and the location of new plants and facilities in industrial enterprise districts. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are major substantive rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A and must be presented to the Legislature for review no later than February 1, 1998.

SUMMARY

This bill allows a municipality to petition the Public Utilities Commission to establish within the municipality an industrial enterprise district in which electric rates are reduced for eligible businesses. The commission is directed to adopt major substantive rules governing the establishment of these districts and the terms and conditions of the reduced rate offerings. The rules must be submitted for legislative review no later than February 1, 1998.
