COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 169, L.D. 498

Bureau of Warden Service, within the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

The bill includes deallocations of \$206,836 and \$250,000 in fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99, respectively, to the Endangered
Nongame Operations program to reflect the reduced amounts of dedicated revenue available to support this program. Additional allocations to the Enforcement Operations - Inland Fisheries and Wildlife program of \$206,836 in fiscal year 1997-98 and \$249,200
in fiscal year 1998-99 are included to reflect the additional amounts of dedicated revenue accruing to that program.'

SUMMARY

16 This is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

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This amendment changes the allocation of funds received through the sale of the environmental license plate so that half of the amount currently received by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is allocated to the Bureau of Warden Service and used to enforce boating, snowmobile and ATV laws.
