Contamination and pollution can occur in waters beyond Maine's territorial sea or coastal waters. Under broader federal authorization, a regulatory action could be taken by states that would apply to vessels registered in that state. This bill allows the Commissioner of Marine Resources to close waters to the extent of the federal exclusive economic zone, 200 miles, as it applies to Maine registered vessels.
