28	Amend the bill by striking out all of section 1 (page 1, lines 3 to 18 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:
30	Sec. 1. 13 MRSA §1306 is enacted to read:
32	§1306. Cemetery perpetual care fund
34	A person, corporation or any other private entity that controls a cemetery shall establish a cemetery perpetual care
36	fund. This fund is separate from any permanent care and
38	improvement fund for a community mausoleum on a cemetery's premises established under section 1348. The income from the
40	cemetery perpetual care fund must be devoted to maintenance of the cemetery. This cemetery perpetual care fund must be created
42	by depositing in the fund at least 30% of the proceeds received, in full and in installments, from the sale of lots and plots in
44	the cemetery. This section does not apply to a family burying ground as described in section 1142. The sale of a cemetery lot
46	or plot that is subject to a contract for the perpetual care of the lot or plot or for general cemetery maintenance is exempt
48	from this section, as long as the contract requires that at least 30% of the proceeds from the sale of the lot or plot be set aside

This amendment renames the fund for the maintenance of cemeteries the cemetery perpetual care fund, provides that the fund is to be used only for the maintenance of the cemetery and not for major improvements, and provides that only private owners of cemeteries are required to establish the fund. Family cemeteries are exempt from the requirement to establish a maintenance fund. The amendment also exempts the sale of cemetery plots that are subject to a contract for perpetual care that is at least as stringent as the provisions of the bill.
