An Act to Create a Cemetery Permanent Care and Improvement Fund.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

#### Sec. 1. 13 MRSA §1306 is enacted to read:

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### §1306. Cemetery permanent care and improvement fund

A person, municipality, corporation or any other entity that 8 controls a cemetery shall establish a permanent care and improvement fund separate from the permanent care and improvement 10 fund for a community mausoleum on its premises. The income from this cemetery permanent care and improvement fund must be devoted 12 to maintenance of the cemetery and the avenues, paths and structures in the cemetery. This cemetery permanent care and 14 improvement fund must be created by depositing in the fund at least 30% of the proceeds received, in full and in installments, from the sale of lots and plots in the cemetery. This section 16 does not apply to a family burying ground as described in section 18 1142.

#### SUMMARY

This bill requires a person, municipality, corporation or any other entity that controls a cemetery to establish a permanent care and improvement fund, the income from which must be devoted to cemetery maintenance. At least 30% of the proceeds received from the sale of lots and plots in the cemetery must be deposited in this fund. A family burying ground is exempt from the requirements of the bill.
