Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not 26 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 28 Whereas, these changes to the laws pertaining 30 water-skiing events must take effect prior to the start of the water-skiing season; and 32 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 34 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 36 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, 38 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 40 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7802, sub-§3 is enacted to read: 42 3. Sanctioned water-skiing courses. The prohibition in subsection 1 does not apply to watercraft towing a water-skier on 44 a water-skiing course for slalom, jump or trick events operated 46 under a permit issued by the commissioner under this subsection. The commissioner may issue a permit for a water-skiing course 48 that is located in whole or in part in the water safety zone if the commissioner determines that: 50

	waters within 200 feet of any shoreline of the mainland or an
18	island.
20	Boats using a permitted water-skiing course, either for
	practice or during an exhibition, are allowed to operate at
22	greater than headway speed within the water safety zone. The
	annual fee for a permit is \$25.

	The amendment requires that an applicant obtain the
26	permission of all property owners within 75 feet of any buoy
	associated with the water-skiing course as a condition of
28	obtaining a permit. The amendment also specifies certain
	dimensional and other safety requirements that apply to any
30	course permitted by the commissioner.
32	The amendment includes a provision that repeals the
	permitting authority on March 31, 1999.
