An Act to Extend Medicaid Coverage to Certain Children.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174-G, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 502, Pt. A, §72, is amended to read:

6 1. Delivery of services. The department shall provide for the delivery of federally approved Medicaid services to qualified pregnant women up to 60 days following delivery and-infants-up-te 8 ene--vear-of--age when the woman's er--child's family income is below 185% 133% of the nonfarm income official poverty line and 10 ehildren-under-5-years-of-age-and; to qualified elderly and disabled persons, when the ehild's-er person's family income is 12 below 100% of the nonfarm income official poverty line; and to children under 19 years of age when the child's family income is 14 below 133% of the nonfarm income official poverty line. The official poverty line shall <u>must</u> be that applicable to a family 16 of the size involved, as defined by the Federal Office of Management and Budget and revised annually in accordance with the 18 United States Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981, Section 673, Subsection 2. 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# Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §3192 is enacted to read:

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### §3192. Healthy Children's Trust Fund

The Healthy Children's Trust Fund, referred to in this section as the "trust fund," is established within the department to finance the Medicaid services provided to children under 19 years of age pursuant to section 3174-G, subsection 1. The trust fund does not lapse, but carries forward from one fiscal year to the next. The commissioner shall oversee and administer the trust fund.

Interim funding. For fiscal year 1998-99, funding must
 be provided for the trust fund from the General Fund.

38 2. Permanent funding. For subsequent fiscal years, the commissioner shall seek funding from outside sources, including
 40 nonprofit hospital or medical service organizations. If the commissioner determines that there is insufficient funding from
 42 outside sources to fully fund the trust fund, then funding sufficient to make up the shortfall must be provided from the
 44 General Fund.

#### **SUMMARY**

50 This bill extends Medicaid coverage to children under the age of 19 whose family income is below 133% of the nonfarm income 52 poverty line. This bill establishes the Healthy Children's Trust

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Fund within the Department of Human Services to fund the Medicaid expansion.

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This bill provides that interim funding for the Healthy Children's Trust Fund comes from the General Fund in fiscal year
1998-99. After the next fiscal year, the Commissioner of Human Services is required to seek funding from outside sources such as
Maine Blue Cross/Blue Shield, who has agreed to participate in the funding of the trust fund, absent unforeseen circumstances
that would prevent them from doing so. If sufficient funding is unavailable, then the funds must be provided from the General
Fund.
