18 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 389, L.D. 534, Bill, "An 20 Act to Require Legislators to Pay a Portion of Their Health and Dental Insurance Premiums"

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting 24 clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §285, sub-§7, as amended by PL 1997, c. 24,
Pt. C, §1 and c. 80, §4, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

7. Payment by State. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the State, through the commission, shall pay 100% of 32 only the employee's share of the individual premium for the standard plan identified and offered by the commission and 34 available to the employee as authorized by the commission, except for Legislators, for whom the State shall pay 80% of the health 36 plan premium for personal coverage or the cash value of that benefit to the Legislator, if the Legislator so chooses. For any 38 dental insurance plan covering Legislators, the State, through the commission, shall pay 80% of a Legislator's personal coverage 40 or the cash value of that benefit to the Legislator, if the Legislator so chooses. A Legislator shall pay the remaining 42 percentage of the health plan or dental insurance premium. For any person appointed to a position after November 1, 1981, who is 44 employed less than full time, the State shall pay a share of the 46 employee's share reduced pro rata to reflect the reduced number of work hours. The State may not pay any portion of the health plan premium for a blind person eligible for the group health 48 plan under subsection 1, paragraph H. 50

For persons who were first employed before July 1, 1991, the State shall pay 100% of only the retiree's share of the premiums

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "//" to H.P. 389, L.D. 534

2 Deappropriates funds from savings that result from 4 changing the level of the State's contribution for 6 Legislators' health and dental insurance.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

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22 These changes to the level of the State's contributions for Legislators' health and dental insurance coverage will result in 24 General Fund savings to the Legislature of \$230,482 in fiscal year 1997-98 and \$334,718 in fiscal year 1998-99. These amounts 26 are deappropriated.'

SUMMARY

The amendment replaces the original bill for the purpose of incorporating Public Law 1997, chapters 24 and 80 in order to avoid a conflict. The amendment does not change the original intent of the bill, which would require Legislators to pay 20% of the premium for health and dental insurance coverage. The amendment also retains the provision that allows Legislators the option of receiving the cash value of the insurance benefits in lieu of the state contribution. The amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note.
