	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §1202, sub-§1, as repealed and replaced by
4	PL 1985, c. 821, §5, is amended to read:
б	<b>1.</b> A person convicted of a Class A crime may be placed on probation for a period not to exceed 6 <u>10</u> years; for a Class B or
8	Class C crime, for a period of probation not to exceed 4 <u>6</u> years; and for Class D and Class E crimes, for a period not to exceed
10	ene-year 2 years.

	This bill increases the authorized periods of probation for
16	Class A, B, C, D and E crimes as follows: For a Class A crime from 6 to 10 years, for a Class B or C crime from 4 to 6 years
18	and for a Class D or E crime from one to 2 years.
