Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §13058, sub-§19 is enacted to read:

19. Livable wage standards. The commissioner shall ensure
that all programs and functions of the department that provide
business assistance subsidies under this chapter are directed to
businesses that pay direct compensation to the employees of the
businesses of at least \$11.54 per hour. For the purposes of this
subsection owners of businesses are considered to be employees
and their earnings must be calculated from their annual income
derived from their businesses.

SUMMARY

This bill requires all business assistance subsidies 18 provided by the Department of Economic and Community Development to be directed to employers that pay at least \$11.54 per hour in 20 direct compensation.
