HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 418,

L.D. 568, Bill, "An Act to Implement the Recommendations of the
Commission to Study Poverty Among Working Parents with Regard to

Raising the Minimum Wage"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 1 (page 1, lines 28 to 36 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 305, §1, is amended to read:

SECOND REGULAR SESSION

1. Minimum wage. The Except as provided in subsection 1-A,
the minimum hourly wage is \$4.25 per hour. If the highest
federal minimum wage is increased in excess of \$4.25 per hour,
the minimum wage must be increased to the same amount, effective
on the same date as the increase in the federal minimum wage, but
in no case may the minimum wage exceed \$5.15 per hour.

Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:

1-A. Minimum wage: employers with more than 10 employees on premises. This subsection applies only to employees employed by employers with more than 10 employees on the premises. The minimum hourly wage, beginning January 1, 1999, is \$5.40 per hour. If the highest federal minimum wage is increased in excess of \$5.40 per hour, the minimum wage must be increased to the same amount, effective on the same date as the increase in the federal minimum wage.
