18 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 418, L.D. 568, Bill, "An 20 Act to Implement the Recommendations of the Commission to Study Poverty Among Working Parents with Regard to Raising the Minimum 22 Wage"

24 Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the 26 following:

'Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 305, §1, is amended to read:

Minimum wage. The minimum hourly wage, beginning January
<u>1, 1999</u>, is \$4-25 <u>\$5.40</u> per hour. If the highest federal minimum wage is increased in excess of \$4-25 <u>\$5.40</u> per hour, the minimum
wage must be increased to the same amount, effective on the same date as the increase in the federal minimum wage, but - in -no - case
may-the-minimum-wage-exceed-\$5-15-per-hour.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

This bill will require the revision of the minimum wage 14 poster by the Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Standards. A General Fund appropriation of \$11,259 in fiscal year 1998-99 will 16 be required for printing and mailing costs. If other bills are enacted that also require changes to this poster, the costs 18 properly allocated to this bill can be reduced.'

SUMMARY

This is the majority amendment of the Joint Standing 24 Committee on Labor. It replaces the bill and establishes a minimum wage of \$5.40 per hour, beginning January 1, 1999. The 26 amendment also adds an appropriation and a fiscal note to the bill.
