## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 305, §1, is amended to read:

6 1. Minimum wage. The minimum hourly wage, beginning October 15, 1997, is \$4-25-per-hear .25¢ more than the highest federal 8 minimum wage. If-the-highest-federal-minimum-wage-is-increased in-excess-of--\$4-25-per-hour--the-minimum-wage-must-be-increased 10 to-the-same-amount,-effective on the same date as the increase in the - federal - minimum - wage, - but - in - no - case - may - the - minimum - wage 12 exceed-\$5.15-per-hour. The minimum hourly wage established by this section must be increased on April 1, 1998 and each April 14 1st thereafter by the percent increase, if any, in the state average weekly wage for the preceding calendar year as determined 16 by the Bureau of Unemployment Compensation.

## **SUMMARY**

This bill establishes a new state minimum wage consisting of a base wage that is .25¢ per hour more than the federal minimum wage. The bill also provides an annual adjustment based on the increase in the state average weekly wage.
