Sec. 1. Department of Education to review laws. Resolved: That
2 the Department of Education, in consultation with the Maine
4 Council on Vocational Education, shall review the laws governing
6 applied technology centers and regions and propose clarifications
8 to those laws, including, but not limited to, listing all of the
proper sending schools to all of the applied technology centers
and applied technology regions; and be it further

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the Department of Education
10 shall submit its report, along with any necessary implementing
12 legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and
Cultural Affairs no later than December 1, 1997.
