

2 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
as emergencies; and

6 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the
beginning of the next fiscal year; and

8 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the
operation of the Department of Environmental Protection will
become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1997; and

12 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
14 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
16 safety; now, therefore,

18 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

20 **Sec. 1. Allocation of the Ground Water Oil Clean-up Fund.** Income
to the Ground Water Oil Clean-up Fund for the next 2 fiscal
22 years, from July 1, 1997 to June 30, 1998 and from July 1, 1998
to June 30, 1999, must be segregated, apportioned and disbursed

that have been approved by the Department of Administrative and

Financial Services and submitted for legislative review prior to

the effective date of this Act.
