and transportation of hazardous waste will result in a one-time reduction in fees collected by the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund within the Department of Environmental Protection. The estimated reduction of dedicated revenue is \$140,000 in fiscal year 1997-98. The fund has adequate resources to absorb this one-time loss of dedicated revenues.'

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources, changes the title of the bill. The amendment caps the fees that may be required for hazardous waste transported off a federally declared Superfund site that was added to the national priorities list by the United States Environmental Protection Agency on or before January 1, 1997 at \$200,000 per site in any calendar year. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
