An Act Requiring Qualified Investigation of Certain Truck-related and Bus-related Fatalities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA $\S 2251$, sub- $\S 4$, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, $\S 2$ and affected by Pt. B, $\S 5$, is amended to read:
4. Investigation. A law enforcement officer who investigates a reportable accident shall:
A. Interview participants and witnesses; and
B. Within 5 days from the time of notification of the
accident, transmit a written report containing all available information to the Chief of the State Police.
Every reported accident must be promptly investigated.
If the accident results in serious bodily injury or death of any
person, the investigation must be conducted by an officer who has
met the training standards of a full-time law enforcement
officer. The investigation of an accident that results in the
death of any person and involves a bus or a truck that weighs
10,000 pounds or more must be conducted by the investigators from
the State Police accident reconstruction program and the
commercial vehicle enforcement unit. These investigators may travel out of state when necessary in the course of an
investigation. A prosecution arising out of an investigation of
an accident that results in the death of any person and involves
a bus or a truck that weighs 10,000 pounds or more must be
conducted by the Department of the Attorney General.
SUMMARY
This bill requires that the investigators from the Maine

State Police accident reconstruction program and the commercial vehicle enforcement unit must investigate a fatal accident involving a bus or a truck that weighs 10,000 pounds or more.

These investigators may travel out of state when necessary in the course of an investigation. A prosecution arising out of such an investigation must be conducted by the Department of the Attorney General.
