Resolve, to Require a Plan for a Register of Nonlicensed Persons Who Provide Health Care Services.

Presented by Representative FARNSWORTH of Portland. Cosponsored by Representatives: AHEARNE of Madawaska, COWGER of Hallowell, FULLER of Manchester, KANE of Saco, SAXL of Bangor. Whereas, there is a movement by a variety of health care and long-term care providers to support individuals in the community and to have personal support provided by unlicensed persons; and

Whereas, people are living longer and living in communities 6 apart from their families; and

Whereas, the types of acceptable support for individuals in the community have multiplied rapidly; and

Whereas, it would assist state agencies, providers of services and the consumer if there were a central register of nonlicensed support and personal care providers; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 3. Budget. Resolved: That the departments shall prepare a budget covering registration, production and dissemination of the register and the cost of investigating and acting upon complaints that might affect a registrant's future eligibility and shall set the registration fee necessary to meet this budget; and be it further

40 Sec. 4. Reporting Date. Resolved: That the departments shall present a brief written report of the recommended plan to the
 42 Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services by January 1, 1998 and an oral report to that committee by February 1, 1998.
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SUMMARY

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This resolve requires the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse and the Department of

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Human Services to prepare for the Legislature a plan for a register of personal care and support providers who are not otherwise regulated.

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
