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m - 3 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to S.P. 207, L.D. 666

Whereas, this legislation needs to be enacted to allow Maine's elderly residents immediate access to reverse mortgages; and

C"A" 5-12

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 12 summary the following:

14 'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

FISCAL NOTE

The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

SUMMARY

28 This amendment adds an emergency preamble, an emergency clause and a fiscal note to the bill.
