1. Minimum wage. The minimum hourly wage is \$4.25 per hour. Effective January 1, 1998, the minimum hourly wage is \$5.60 per hour and effective January 1, 1999, the minimum hourly wage is \$6.05 per hour. If the highest federal minimum wage is increased in excess of \$4.25-per-hour the minimum hourly wage established in this subsection, the minimum wage must be increased to the same amount, effective on the same date as the increase in the federal minimum wage, but in -in -no -ease - may - the minimum-wage-exceed-\$5.15-per-hour.

SUMMARY

This bill raises the minimum wage to \$5.60 per hour effective January 1, 1998 and to \$6.05 per hour effective January 1, 1999.
