An Act to Amend the Laws Regarding Scallop Harvesting.

Presented by Representative GOODWIN of Pembroke. Cosponsored by Representatives: BAGLEY of Machias, BUNKER of Kossuth Township, DRISCOLL of Calais, PINKHAM of Lamoine. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, measures to conserve scallop resources and measures to prevent gear conflict among people harvesting in different fisheries need immediate attention; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6171-A, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

 6. Scallop limitations. The commissioner may not adopt
rules for scallop harvesting under this section that are more restrictive than the closed dates for scallop harvesting under
section 6672 unless those rules apply throughout the coastal waters of the State.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6722, as amended by PL 1983, c. 685, is further amended to read:

#### 28 §6722. Closed areas

30 Unless modified by regulation adopted under section 6171-A, it is unlawful to fish for or take scallops in the coastal waters
32 from April 16th to Oetober--31st November 30th, both days inclusive.

Sec. 10. 12 MRSA §6954-B, as amended by PL 1995, c. 518, §1, 36 is repealed.

38 Sec. 11. 12 MRSA §6954-C is enacted to read:

#### 40 <u>§6954-C. Drag limits north of international bridge, Lubec</u>

42 1. Maximum requirements. It is unlawful to fish in the coastal waters northerly and inshore of the international bridge
44 that connects Lubec to Campobello Island, New Brunswick, Canada with any one drag or combination of drags:

A. That measure in excess of 5 feet, 6 inches in width by 48 measuring from the extreme outside edge of the mouth of the drag or drags;

## C. If used for the taking of scallops, that are greater than 8 rings deep.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

#### SUMMARY

This bill creates a scallop fishing season that lasts from 14 December 1st to April 15th. It requires that any gear-conflict prevention rules that adjust the scallop harvesting dates be 16 applied statewide if the rules result in a more restrictive season than that of December 1st to April 15th. It also expands 18 the current dragging limitations for South Bay in Lubec to apply to all of Cobscook Bay and the Maine waters of Passamaquoddy Bay 20 and it adds a limit on the ring size. The limitations are:

 A maximum drag width of 5 feet, 6 inches for any combination of drags;

2. A minimum ring diameter of 3 inches; and

When a drag is used to harvest scallops, a maximum drag
depth of 8 rings.
