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vagueness regarding whether a particular act is pursuant to usual and customary standards of medical practice.

The bill proposed a reduction in the severity of the crime of involuntary manslaughter of a fetus when based on the reckless or criminally negligent operation of a motor vehicle. The Maine Criminal Code contained a similar reduction for vehicular homicide until the enactment of Public Law 1997, chapter 34. This amendment removes that provision to provide consistency with the recent changes to the Maine Criminal Code.

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
