	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7432, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1989, c. 913,
4	Pt. B, §6, is further amended to read:
б	2. Failure to visit traps. A person is guilty of failure to visit traps if that person:
8	A. While trapping in any organized or incorporated place,
10	fails to visit each trap, except under ice water sets for beaver and muskrat, or fails to cause the same to be visited
12	at least once in every calendar day, including Sunday;
14	B. While trapping in any unorganized or deorganized place, fails to visit each trap, except <u>for leg hold traps set for</u>
16	<u>coyote,</u> killer-type traps and water sets, so-called, or fails to cause the same to be visited at least once in every
18	calendar day, including Sunday; ⊖≆
20	C. While trapping in any unorganized or deorganized place, fails to visit each killer-type trap or water set,
22	so-called, except under ice water sets for beaver and muskrat, or fails to cause the same to be visited at least
24	once in every 5 calendar days, including Sunday+ <u>; or</u>
26	E. While trapping in any unorganized or deorganized place, fails to visit a leg hold trap set for coyote or fails to
28	<u>cause the same to be visited at least once every 72 hours, including Sunday.</u>

32	SUMMARY

36	This bill requires leg hold traps set for coyote in unorganized or deorganized places to be checked at least once every 72 hours. Current law requires those traps to be visited
38	at least once a day.
