б	3. Suspension of provisional license. A special restricted license is a provisional license. Notwithstanding chapter 23,
8	subchapter III, article 2 andinadditiontosection1302, subsection2, the Secretary of State shall suspend a special

6	last known address of a licensee if the provisions are expanded or extended as described in subsection 7.
8	12. Violation. A person who violates subsection 4 or 6 commits a civil infraction.

12	13. Notice to parent. If a person violates subsection 4 or 6, the Secretary of State shall send written notification of any conviction of a civil infraction or moving violation to a parent
14	or legal guardian of the person.
16	14. Dates for determining violations. For the purposes of this section. The following criteria are used as the dates for
18	determining violations.
20	A. If a person is convicted of a moving violation, the date of the arrest for the violation is used in determining
22	whether the conviction occurred within a provisional period under this section.

34	indicates a moving violation on the part of the licensee or indicates the licensee had been under the influence of
36	intoxicants or drinking intoxicating liquor.
38	15. Possession of graduated licensing status. A person must have that person's graduated licensing status in that
40	person's immediate possession at all times when operating a motor vehicle and must display the card upon demand of a police
42	officer. A person who violates this subsection commits a civil infraction.

46	16. Exempt. This section does not apply to a person 15 years of age or older who is currently enrolled in but has not
48	completed a driver education course by April 1, 1997 or who has
40	completed a driver education course but has not acquired a driver's license by April 1, 1997.

17. Repeal. This section is repealed April 1, 2002.
