Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of state departments and institutions will become due and payable on or after July 1, 1997; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Block grant allocations. In order to provide for
necessary expenditures of State Government and other purposes for
the fiscal years ending June 30, 1998 and June 30, 1999, the
following sums, as designated in the following tabulations, are
allocated from the revenues derived from federal block grants.
Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, all federal block
grant allocations included in this Act are subject to the Maine
Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585.

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Sec. 2. Additional funds. Any additional funds that might become available due to implementation of the block grants and the possible overlapping of other grants may be carried forward for future allocation by the Legislature or may be used to offset any possible reductions in the block grants.

Sec. 3. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legislature and those reclassifications or range changes that have been approved by the Department of Administrative and Financial Services and submitted for legislative review prior to the effective date of this Act.

Sec. 4. Encumbered balances at year end. 28 At the end of each fiscal year, all encumbered balances may not be carried more than once, except that encumbered balances 30 in theCommunity Development Block Grant may be carried twice and encumbered balances of grant awards for capital construction projects may 32 carry until the completion of the project, provided that the 34 construction was started prior to the end of the year for which the allocation was made. 36

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 38 preamble, this Act takes effect July 1, 1997.
