C. For an injury caused, by acts of persons to whom permission to pursue any recreational or harvesting activities was granted, to other persons to whom the person granting permission, or the owner, lessee, manager, holder of an easement or occupant of the premises, owed a duty to keep the premises safe or to warn of danger. This paragraph does not apply to independent contractors hired for timber harvesting activities.

SUMMARY

Current law limits the liability of landowners upon whose land recreational or harvesting activities are performed. The landowner is still responsible for harm to a person caused by another person to whom the landowner granted permission to pursue recreational or harvesting activities.

This bill extends the limitation of liability to landowners who hire independent contractors to perform timber harvesting activities on the landowner's property, regardless of who causes the injury.
