An Act to Exempt Permitted Auto Recyclers from the Solid Waste Management Rules.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §3755-A, sub-§3, ¶I is enacted to read: 4 I. The storage areas for tires must be in accordance with 6 the following standards. 8 (1) The total area for tire storage must be less than 10,000 square feet by 10 feet high. 10 (2) A 50-feet wide strip cleared to mineral soil must be constructed and maintained around the perimeter of 12 each tire storage area and fire lanes must be constructed and maintained through the interior of each $\mathbf{14}$ tire storage area. 16 Sec. 2. 30-A MRSA §3755-A, sub-§6 is enacted to read: 18 6. Rules. An automobile recycling business licensed under 20 this section is exempt from the Board of Environmental Protection's solid waste management rules relating to tire 22 <u>storage.</u> 24 **SUMMARY** 26 This bill requires that an automobile recycling business 28 with an automobile recycling business permit issued by themunicipality in which it is located meet the following standards 30 for tire storage areas: 1. The total area for tire storage must be less than 10,000 32 square feet by 10 feet high; and 34 2. Fire lanes must be constructed and maintained. 36 The bill exempts an automobile recycling business with an 38 automobile recycling business permit from the Board of Environmental Protection's solid waste management rules relating 40 to tire storage.
