An Act to Provide Legislators with the Same Health Benefits as State Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §803, sub-§5 is enacted to read:

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5. Group life insurance. For each member eligible for group life insurance in accordance with Title 5, chapter 425, subchapter VI, the State shall pay the costs for basic coverage. Additional coverage may be purchased in accordance with Title 5, chapter 425.

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- Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §285, sub-§7, as amended by PL 1995, c. 368, Pt. G, §2, is further amended to read:
- 7. Payment by State. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the State, through the commission, shall pay 100% of only the employee's share of this health plan, except for Legislators, for whom the State shall pay 50% 60% of the health plan premium for dependent coverage. For any person appointed to a position after November 1, 1981, who is employed less than full time, the State shall pay a share of the employee's share reduced pro rata to reflect the reduced number of work hours.

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- For persons who were first employed before July 1, 1991, the State shall pay 100% of only the retiree's share of the premiums for this health plan for persons who were previously eligible for this health plan pursuant to subsection 1, paragraph A and who have subsequently become eligible pursuant to subsection 1, paragraph G.
- For persons who were first employed by the State after July 1, 1991, the State shall pay a pro rata share portion of only the retiree's share of the premiums, as described in this section,
- for this health plan for persons who were previously eligible for 34 this health plan pursuant to subsection 1, paragraph A and who have subsequently become eligible pursuant to subsection 1,
- paragraph G based on the total number of years of participation in the group health plan prior to retirement as follows:

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4.0	Years of Participation	State Portion
40	10 or more years	100% group health plan
44	9 but less than 10 years	90% group health plan
46	8 but less than 9 years	80% group health plan premium
48	7 but less than 8 years	70% group health plan premium
50	6 but less than 7 years	60% group health plan premium

2	5 but less than 6 years 50% group health plan premium	
	Less than 5 years No contribution	
4	Sec. 3. Effective date. This Act takes effect December 2, 1998.	
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8	SUMMARY	
10	This bill would provide Legislators with the same percentage of dependent coverage as other state employees. The bill also	
12	requires the retirement system to pay the costs of basic life insurance, as is the current policy for other state employees.	
14	The change will become effective December 2, 1998, for the 119th Legislature.
