18 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 595, L.D. 786, Bill, "An 20 Act to Increase the Department of Marine Resources' Involvement in Dredge Permitting"

Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 1 to 4 and 24 inserting in their place the following:

'Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §480-D, sub-§9, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 656, §3, is amended to read:

9. Dredging. If the proposed activity involves dredging, 30 dredge spoils disposal or transporting dredge spoils by water, the applicant shall demonstrate that the transportation route minimizes adverse impacts on the fishing industry and that the 32 disposal site is geologically suitable. The--department--shall 34 consult-with-the-Department-of-Marine-Resources-in-assessing-the impacts--on--the--fishing--industry-The Commissioner of Marine Resources shall provide the department with an assessment of the 36 impacts on the fishing industry of a proposed dredging operation in the coastal wetlands. The assessment must consider impacts to 38 the area to be dredged and impacts to the fishing industry of a proposed route to transport dredge spoils to an ocean disposal 40 site. The Commissioner of Marine Resources must hold a public hearing on the proposed dredging operation within at least one of 42 the municipalities in which the dredging operation would take 44 place. In making its determination under this subsection, the department must take into consideration the assessment provided by the Commissioner of Marine Resources. The permit must inelude 46 a-requirement-that require the applicant publish-the-approved transportation--route-of-the-dredge--spoils-in-a-newspaper-of 48 general-eireulation-in-the-area-adjacent-te-the-route. to:

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ý V A. Clearly mark or designate the dredging area, the spoils disposal route and the transportation route;

B. Publish in a newspaper of general circulation in the area adjacent to the route the approved transportation route of the dredge spoils; and

8 <u>C. Publish in a newspaper of general circulation in the</u> area adjacent to the route a procedure that the applicant 10 will use to respond to inquiries regarding the loss of fishing gear during the dredging operation.'

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any 14 nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Marine Resources will incur some minor additional costs to assess certain dredging projects and to hold public hearings. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.

28 This bill may increase prosecutions for Class E crimes. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties 30 are estimated to be \$83.78 per day per prisoner. These costs are not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may 32 result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new criminal cases and civil suits filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines and filing fees may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

SUMMARY

This amendment requires that the Commissioner of Marine Resources provide the Department of Environmental Protection an assessment of the impacts of a proposed dredging operation on the fishing industry. It also requires that a person granted a dredging permit clearly mark or designate the dredging area, the spoils disposal route and the transportation route; publish in a

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newspaper of general circulation in the area adjacent to the route the approved transportation route of the dredge spoils; and publish in a newspaper of general circulation in the area adjacent to the route a procedure that the applicant will use to respond to inquiries regarding the loss of fishing gear during the dredging operation.

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
