Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §254, sub-§5, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 693,

 §§5 and 8, is amended to read:
- 5. Medication. The commissioner may adopt or amend rules for the administration of medication in public or approved private schools. Medication may not be administered only by unlicensed licensed personnel at these schools, except -- as provided-by-the-written-prescription-of-a-physician-or-dentist-or by-the-written-permission-of-the-parent-or-guardian-of-the individual-receiving-the-medication.

This bill permits only licensed personnel to administer medication in the public schools or approved private schools.
