	A. A procedure by which to notify parents about t complaint process, whom to contact, the time frame of t complaint process and their right to provide the complai investigator with a list of witnesses;
	B. A requirement that the parents receive a writt acknowledgment after the filing of a complaint;
	C. A requirement that the complaint resolution meeti concerning preliminary findings include parents and scho representatives;
	D. A model complaint form; and
	E. A requirement for on-site monitoring of compliance wi the decision of the complaint investigator.
