	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §371-B is enacted to read:
4	§371-B. Selection; qualifications
6	3371-D. Delection, qualifications
8	1. Manner of election or appointment. Sheriffs are elected or appointed and hold their offices according to the Constitution of Maine. Their election must be conducted and determined as is
10	provided for county commissioners. Sheriffs take office on the first day of January following their election.

14	2. Minimum qualifications for sheriffs. A person may not be appointed to the office of sheriff, be a candidate for election to the office of sheriff or serve as sheriff of any
16	county in the State unless the candidate meets the following
18	qualifications: A. The candidate attests to the Law Enforcement Code of
20	Ethics:
22	B. The candidate applies to the Secretary of State for a criminal background investigation to confirm that the
24	candidate has no felony convictions; and
26	C. The candidate is a certified law enforcement officer or a certified corrections officer.

30	3. Exception. Any person who is serving in the office of sheriff on the effective date of this section is deemed to meet the minimum qualifications of subsection 2.
