Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §3009, sub-§1, ¶B, as amended by PL 1991, c.
549, §16 and affected by §17, is further amended to read:
B. The municipal officers may regulate the operation of all vehicles in the public ways and on publicly owned property.
(1) The violation of any ordinance authorized by this paragraph is a civil violation.
(2) A municipality may not adopt or enforce an ordinance authorized by this paragraph that is the same
as or conflicts with any speed or other traffic control limits imposed by the Department of Transportation
pursuant to Title 29-A. This subparagraph is repealed
90 days after adjournment of the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature.
Sec. 2. Report. The Joint Standing Committee on
Transportation may report out legislation on the issue of
