6	H. Signs bearing political messages relating to an election, primary or referendum, provided that these signs
8	may not be placed within the right-of-way prior to $-6-3$ weeks before the election, primary or referendum to which
10	they relate and must be removed by the candidate or political committee not later than one week thereafter.
