COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 640, L.D. 865, Bill, "An Act Regarding the Self-governance of Biddeford Pool"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act to Create a Body Politic and Corporate by the Name of Biddeford Pool Village Corporation'

28 Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the following: 30

Sec. 1. Separation and incorporation; Biddeford Pool. 32 The following territory within the City of Biddeford and the County 34 of York is hereby created as a body politic and corporate and a political subdivision of the State by the name of Biddeford Pool Village Corporation and referred to in 36 this Act as the "corporation":

Bounded southerly by the following described line: Beginning at 40 an iron rod to be set flush with the ground at the intersection of the apparent northeasterly sideline of Bridge Street with the 42 apparent northwesterly sideline of Mile Stretch Road now located in the City of Biddeford, County of York, State of Maine; said corner marker is referred to as Corner A; 44

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46 Thence running from Corner A easterly across Mile Stretch Road to the point of intersection of the northeasterly sideline of Beach 48 Avenue with the southeasterly sideline of Mile Stretch Road;

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Thence continuing southeasterly by and along the northeasterly sideline of Beach Avenue to the terminus of Beach Avenue right-of-way; and

Thence continuing southeasterly by a prolongation of the last described course of the northeasterly sideline of Beach Avenue, to the Atlantic Ocean, extending so far as the present boundary of the City of Biddeford extends or so far as state statute dictates.

Bounded westerly by the following described line: Beginning at 12 Corner A as above described thence running northerly 10 feet, more or less, to a granite monument to be set; said granite monument is referred to as Corner B. The course of Line A-B is 14 the same course as a straight line running from the set position of Corner A to the southeasterlymost corner of the concrete sea 16 wall situated on land now or formerly owned by Edward L. Eisenstadt, said land being further described as 196 Hills Beach 18 Road and as Lot No. 47 on the 1994 City of Biddeford Assessors Map No. 55. Corner B is set along this line. If a future survey 20 finds a differing position for the sideline intersection of Bridge Street with Mile Stretch Road, Corner A, the granite 22 monument set, Corner B, and the original course A-B are held to Corner C. 24

Thence continuing from Corner B northerly by a prolongation of course A-B to the point where said prolongated course A-B
intersects the centerline of the channel draining "Back Bay" so-called; said channel drains from northwest to southeast and is
evident at low tide; said channel centerline is defined as the midpoint between both sides of the channel measured at low tide;
said point of that intersection is referred to as Corner C.

Thence cornering and running southeasterly from Corner C by the 34 average centerline course of the above-described channel to a point in the centerline of said channel where the last described 36 southeasterly course of said channel intersects an arc measured radially a distance of 600 feet northwesterly from Point D. Said 38 Point D is a drill hole and marker set at or near the center of the southwesterlymost "icebreaker" located southerly of the "Gut" 40 leading to Wood Island Harbor; said "icebreaker" is further described as being the 3rd of 3 large piles of granite tailings 42 running from the northeast to the southwest off land of the 44 Biddeford Pool Yacht Club situated southeasterly of the "Gut"; Point D is set in a flat slab of granite atop said "icebreaker" near the center of said "icebreaker," the exact point to be set 46 by and at the discretion of a professional land surveyor 48 commissioned by the corporation. The above-described point of intersection between Corner C and Point D is referred to as 50 Corner E.

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The centerline of the channel is defined and measured as the midpoint between both sides of the channel at low tide.

Thence cornering and running easterly from Corner E on a straight line to Corner F; Corner F is a point at or near the surface position of Nun Buoy No. 6, which is shown on the NOAA plan entitled "Saco Bay and Vicinity" dated January 4, 1986; the surface position of said Nun Buoy No. 6 is located by triangulation at high tide in calm seas by and at the discretion of a professional land surveyor commissioned by the corporation; upon affixing a reasonable point to the location of said buoy, said point as fixed is held as Corner F regardless of further movement of said buoy.

16 Thence cornering and running northeasterly from Corner following the average centerline course of the "Gut" to Corner G. Corner G is defined as a point along the average centerline of 18 the channel where the last described northeasterly course of said centerline intersects an arc measured radially a distance of 600 20 feet northeasterly from the northerlymost corner of the granite 22 sea wall on land now or formerly owned by John Oddy situated along the southeasterly edge of the "Gut." The average centerline course of the "Gut" is established in the same manner 24 as Line C-E above-described.

Thence cornering and running northwesterly from Corner G a distance of 2400 feet to Corner H. The course of Line G-H is established as the course of a line running from Corner G through Corner H to the fixed position of Daymarker "5B"; Daymarker "5B" is located approximately 1850 feet northwesterly from the center of Basket Island as shown on the NOAA plan entitled "Saco Bay and Vicinity" dated January 4, 1986.

Thence cornering and running northeasterly from Corner H to a point along the present boundary line between the City of Biddeford and the City of Saco, said point is referred to as Corner I; the course of Line H-I is established as the course of a line running from Corner H to the fixed position of Daymarker "4A"; Daymarker "4A" is located northeasterly of the easterly end of the submerged breakwater positioned along the southerly edge of the outlet channel of the Saco River into the Atlantic Ocean and is shown on the NOAA plan entitled "Saco Bay and Vicinity" 44 dated January 4, 1986.

The westerly boundary as described above runs from Corner A to Corner B to Corner C to Corner E to Corner F to Corner G to
Corner H to Corner I.

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The position of certain corner points and associated lines may be 2 affected by forces of nature present and future. The position of physical features associated with this description is located by a professional land surveyor during the course of his or her 4 commission by the corporation. The position of said physical features as they exist during the course of said commission is 6 accepted and held as the intent of this description. Upon completion of the commissioned survey and the recording of said 8 survey plan at the York County Registry of Deeds, the position of 10 the Corner Points and village corporation boundaries established by said survey holds regardless of future action by natural forces upon said physical features. 12

Bounded northerly by the following described line: Beginning at Corner I thence running easterly by and along the boundary line
of the City of Saco and extending so far easterly as the boundary of the City of Biddeford presently extends or so far as state
statute dictates.

20 Bounded easterly by the following described line: Beginning at the easterly end point of the above-described northerly boundary 22 line thence running southerly to the easterly end point of the first described southerly boundary line, extending so far 24 easterly as the boundary of the City of Biddeford presently extends or so far as state statute dictates.

Permanent markers are set at Corner B and Point D as described 28 above.

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30 Any future retracement survey of the village corporation boundaries herein described holds to the set positions of Corner 32 B and Point D.

Meaning and intending to include within this description all of the peninsula known as Fletchers's Neck and Biddeford Pool
including the land along the so-called Mile Stretch, the town thatch bed, Stage Island, Negro Island, Wood Island, Gooseberry
Island, Beach Island and all other islands within this described area and surrounding waters, which territory is referred to as
"Biddeford Pool Village Corporation."

42 Sec. 2. Powers. The corporation is authorized within its jurisdictional area to build, repair, maintain, plow and provide 44 signs for roads, streets, ways and sidewalks; to build, repair and maintain a system of storm and surface water drainage; to 46 provide for the removal of solid waste; to establish and maintain police services; and to provide for the adoption, amendment, 48 administration and enforcement of a zoning ordinance pursuant to and consistent with a valid comprehensive plan adopted by the 50 voters of the corporation, and subdivision, shoreland zoning,

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floodplain and other land use regulations, including the 2 establishment of a planning board, a zoning board of appeals and fees to fund the costs of administration and enforcement. The 4 corporation does not have authority to enact ordinances regulating traffic, parking or use of the harbor. Ordinances of the City of Biddeford regarding traffic, parking and use of the 6 harbor in effect on June 1, 1997 continue to have effect within 8 the territory of the corporation. Any change in such ordinances after that date have effect only if agreed to by a majority vote of the board of overseers of the corporation. Except as may be 10 provided by contracts between the City of Biddeford and the the City of Biddeford is relieved of 12 corporation, the responsibility to provide the services delegated to the 14 corporation by this Act; except that the City of Biddeford shall continue to provide to the corporation and its inhabitants all other services that it has provided in the past or that may be 16 required by law. The City of Biddeford is relieved of liability 18 for defects in roads, streets, ways or sidewalks within the territorial limits of the corporation and for failure to perform 20 the duties assumed by the corporation. The corporation assumes such duty and liability as would be assumed by the City of 22 Biddeford except for this Act, which liability may be enforced under the same conditions, in the same manner and with the same 24 remedies as are provided by law in relation to municipalities. Except as provided in this Act, the corporation has all of the powers and duties of a village corporation under the general laws 26 of the State. Notwithstanding any general law to the contrary, 28 when any land use ordinance, bylaw or regulation of the corporation conflicts with an ordinance of the City of Biddeford, 30 the ordinance, bylaw or regulation of the corporation prevails.

Sec. 3. Property. The corporation may, by purchase, gift or otherwise, acquire real or personal property and manage, operate, sell, lease, mortgage or exchange that property for the benefit of the corporation. This section does not grant the corporation the power of eminent domain.

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38 Sec. 4. City to pay portion of taxes to corporation. Within 30 days after each due date established by the City of Biddeford for the 40 payment of real and personal property taxes, the City of Biddeford shall designate and transfer to the treasurer of the 42 corporation the greater of 31% of revenue from of all real estate and personal property taxes collected by the city from real and property located 44 personal within the boundaries of the corporation during that payment period, exclusive of any county 46 taxes and the revenue due the corporation for the first full payment period after the corporation is organized, adjusted by any increase in the Consumer Price Index from the first July 1st 48 after which the corporation is organized to the July lst 50 immediately preceding the payment date. In

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addition, with the first transfer of revenue to the corporation 2 following acceptance of the charter, the City of Biddeford shall pay a supplemental amount equal to 2% of revenue from all real 4 estate and personal property taxes collected from real and located within the personal property boundaries of the corporation in the full fiscal year immediately preceding the 6 payment, for the purposes of allowing the corporation to 8 establish a reserve fund for emergencies and unanticipated The board of overseers of the corporation may request expenses. additional funds from the city council of the City of Biddeford 10 to fund emergency expenditures or other additional needs. If the 12 City of Biddeford does not provide additional funding, the board of overseers may request an amendment to this charter by the transfer of 14 Legislature. With each tax revenue to the corporation, the treasurer of the City of Biddeford shall furnish 16 to the corporation the records of account of the city itemizing all tax payments made to the city on account of real or personal property located within the corporation. All revenue transferred 18 by the City of Biddeford to the corporation pursuant to this section must be expended by the corporation for its governmental 20 purposes. If the City of Biddeford fails to make transfers to the corporation by the due date set forth in this section, the city 22 is liable for a penalty, payable to the corporation, equaling 1% of the unpaid transfer due for each week or portion of a week 24 that transfer is not made. Reasonable administrative expenses 26 incurred by the City of Biddeford in complying with this section must be paid by the corporation within 10 business days following 28 receipt of a transfer from the City of Biddeford.

Sec. 5. Fiscal year. The fiscal year of the corporation is the same as the fiscal year of the City of Biddeford.

Sec. 6. Power to borrow money. The corporation is further 34 authorized and vested with the power, upon approval by the voters, to borrow money and issue bonds, notes or other evidences of indebtedness in such amounts as the voters may approve for any 36 of the purposes of the corporation, in the same manner as is provided by law for the borrowing of money and the issuance of 38 bonds, notes or other evidences of indebtedness by municipalities and subject to the same limitations as are provided for the 40 indebtedness of municipalities. The City of Biddeford is not 42 responsible for debts of the corporation incurred pursuant to this section.

Sec. 7. Officers; adoption of ordinances and bylaws. The officers of the corporation are a village administrator, who is employed by the board of overseers and who is clerk and treasurer of the corporation, a board of overseers and such other officers, boards or committees as the bylaws of the corporation may require. The board of overseers consists of 3 or 5 members all

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of whom must be legal voters of the corporation and must be chosen by ballot. The corporation may determine at a meeting 2 held at least 90 days before the annual meeting whether 3 or 5 4 overseers will be elected and their term of office. If the corporation fails to fix the number, 3 overseers must be elected. If the corporation fails to fix the term, it is for one 6 The corporation is empowered to adopt, at any legal year. meeting called for that purpose, ordinances or bylaws for the 8 administration of its government and for the proper management of its affairs and other related purposes, provided those ordinances 10 or bylaws are not repugnant to the laws of the State. Any ordinances or bylaws may be altered or amended at any legal 12 meeting of the corporation in the call for which notice of the proposed change is given. The overseers of the corporation shall 14 give prior written notice to the municipal officers of the City of Biddeford of all proposed ordinances or amendments to the 16 ordinances. The officers of the corporation must be sworn before the clerk of the corporation or a dedimus justice and the 18 treasurer of the corporation shall give bond to the corporation in such sums as the overseers may direct, which bond must be 20 approved by the overseers.

Sec. 8. Parks. The overseers of the corporation, pursuant to 24 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 6304, shall oversee and maintain a certain park located within the 26 corporation's boundaries known as "Vines' Landing." Vines' Landing must at all times be a public park and available to all citizens of the City of Biddeford. 28

Sec. 9. Major natural disaster. lf a natural disaster, including, but not limited to, flood, fire, hurricane, earthquake 32 force majeure, causes significant damage to or other the City essential infrastructure of the corporation, the of Biddeford is obligated to apply for disaster relief funding from 34 the State and Federal Government on behalf of the corporation and to provide other assistance, provided the assistance does not 36 necessitate unreimbursed additional expenditures by the city.

Sec. 10. Qualification of voters. All persons residing within the limits of the corporation who are legal voters in the City of 40 Biddeford may be voters at any meeting of the corporation. The clerk of the corporation shall determine the legal voters at any 42 meeting and shall prepare a list of legal voters prior to each meeting that may be corrected at any time before the meeting or 44 during its progress.

Sec. 11. First election of officers. The first election of officers must be held at the meeting at which this Act is 48 accepted.

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Sec. 12. Acceptance of charter; calling of meetings. This Act may be accepted as the charter of the corporation at any time within 2 2 years from its approval by the Governor but only one meeting to vote on this Act may be called in any one calendar year. Peter 4 McPheeters, Norman Goldthwait, Nancy Guignard, Peggy Ayers and б Wallace Nutting, or any 3 of them, shall call all meetings of the corporation prior to the acceptance of this Act and the election of officers, and notify the legal voters of the corporation to 8 meet at some suitable time and place by posting notices in 2 public places at least 7 days before the time of holding the 10 All meetings held after the acceptance of this Act and meeting. the election of the officers must be called and notices must be 12 posted by the overseers in the same manner as town meetings are called and notices posted by municipal officers. At all meetings 14 of the corporation, a moderator must be chosen in the same manner and with the same power as a moderator in town meetings. 16

Sec. 13. Effective date. This Act takes effect when approved by 18 the Governor so far as to authorize the calling of a meeting or meetings of the corporation for the purpose of voting upon the 20 acceptance of this Act. If this Act is accepted as the charter of the corporation by a majority of the voters of the corporation at 22 a legal meeting called for that purpose, it takes effect 30 days 24 after the vote. The board of overseers shall notify the City of Biddeford of the acceptance of this Act. Within 30 days of being 26 notified, the City of Biddeford shall transfer to the corporation a prorated portion of revenues due the corporation under section 28 4 plus the supplemental 2% of revenues provided for the first year after incorporation in order to build a reserve fund.

Sec. 14. Report. No later than 3 years after the date of 32 acceptance of this Act, the board of overseers of the corporation shall submit a written report to the Executive Director of the 34 Legislative Council and to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over local government matters. 36 The report must include information regarding expenditures by the corporation since its incorporation, experience with and any problems encountered with the City of Biddeford 38 regarding operation of the corporation or any other matter affecting the 40 territory of Biddeford Pool and any other information the board wishes to convey to the Legislature.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 44 summary the following:

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R. O.S.

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'FISCAL NOTE

This bill has no fiscal impact on state revenue or expenditures. This bill does impose several new requirements on the City of Biddeford should the residents of Biddeford Pool choose to form the Biddeford Pool Village Corporation. However, the State will not be required to fund 90% of the costs associated with these requirements because the costs incurred by the city will be reimbursed by the corporation. The State is not required to reimburse the corporation because it is that local unit's decision to incur those costs.'

SUMMARY

16 This amendment replaces the bill. Rather than authorizing Biddeford Pool to secede from the City of Biddeford, it 18 authorizes the residents of Biddeford Pool to form a village The village corporation would take corporation. over responsibility for roads, sidewalks, water drainage, removal of 20 solid waste, police services and regulation of land use, 22 including subdivision and zoning regulations. Current City of Biddeford ordinances regarding traffic, parking or use of the harbor continue to apply in the village corporation territory, 24 but any changes to those ordinances apply only if agreed to by the overseers. The city transfers 31% of revenue from property 26 taxes collected within the village corporation territory. In 28 addition, in the first transfer after incorporation, the city must provide a supplemental 2% transfer to enable the corporation 30 to build a reserve fund for emergencies and unanticipated expenses. The city is subject to a 1% penalty for each week or 32 portion of a week transfer is not made as required.

34 The corporation is managed by a village administrator, a board of overseers comprised of 3 or 5 elected persons and other 36 officers or committees called for by the corporate bylaws. The corporation oversees the park known as Vines' Landing, which 38 remains available to all Biddeford citizens.

All persons who reside in the limits of the corporation and who are legal voters in the City of Biddeford may vote at
 meetings of the corporation.

44 The amendment provides for approval of the charter at any time within 2 years of its approval by the Governor. Any 3 of 46 the 5 named persons may call the first meeting to vote on the charter and, if accepted, to elect officers. If the charter is 48 accepted, it becomes effective 30 days after the vote.

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The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
