Notwithstanding any other provision of law, service credit purchased under this section may be used only for the purpose of increasing the amount of a member's service retirement benefit by inclusion of the purchased service credit and may not be used to establish a member's qualification for a service retirement benefit.
- 3. Return to employment. The member must have returned to state employment after completion of the educational leave.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

This bill will not increase employer contribution rates and will not affect the unfunded actuarial liability of the Maine State Retirement System. The member purchasing the service credit is responsible for the full actuarial cost and the use of this service credit is limited to avoid an increase in the unfunded liability. The system may incur some minor additional administrative costs, which can be absorbed within the system's existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

Like the bill, this amendment authorizes state employees to purchase service credit in the Maine State Retirement System for time spent on unpaid or partially paid educational leave under the Maine Educational Leave Act. The amendment places the new language in a separate statutory section to avoid confusion with other purchase of service credit provisions and requires that the member must return to state service following the educational leave. The amendment restricts use of the service credit purchased to benefit calculation; the additional credit may not be used for vesting or determination of eligibility for retirement purposes. The member must pay the full actuarial cost of the increase in retirement benefits due to the increased

creditable service so there is no increased cost to the retirement system. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
