42	FISCAL NOTE
44	The Department of Labor will incur some minor additional costs to conduct the necessary inspections for compliance with
46	certain age-related employment requirements. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " #" to H.P. 648, L.D. 901

The Judicial Department may realize some minor savings from reductions of workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of cases that will no longer be filed in the court system. Reductions in the collection of fines may decrease General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill. It allows minors under 16 years of age to work in fixed-location commercial places of amusement, except they may not work at games of chance or in hazardous occupations. It prohibits minors under 16 from working in conjunction with an amusement, game or show that allows or conducts betting. Finally, it adds an emergency preamble, emergency clause and fiscal note to the bill.

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
